Project Title:

Ashville’s Roundabout Trail

Location(s) of proposed project:

The ¼ mile by 8 foot track in the Ashville Community Park is well used by residents. The Project would make this track 10 feet. It would also have the intent to connect it to other trails and sidewalks in the village and may be outside the village in the future.

Describe in detail the proposed project, including the reason said project is needed, those responsible for completing the project, the local support for the project (attach any letters of support to end of the application), and the proposed timeline for completing the project.

The track is the only community trail of this kind in Ashville and the surrounding area. The condition has significantly deteriorated since it was paved in the 1980’s, see Exhibit A - Photos of Current Track. It needs to be refurbished to safely maintain and expand its current use. The need and use of this track as grown with the Village. The table to the right indicates the 40 year average growth for the village is 25.63%. There are two categories of groups that use the Community Park. First, several Special Events occur in the park and as part of those event they use this track. Those events include: see Exhibit B - Viking Festival, July Fourth Festival, Fun-in-the-Sun, Gazebo Gatherings, and Trick or Treat Parade. The other group would be those that use the tract every day, every weekend, and/or periodically for walking, jogging, running, or biking. The Ashville Elementary School is just to the south of the park, see Maps Exhibit C. So it can be used before, during or after school. The village held a public meeting on January 16th, see Exhibit D. - Website, Facebook, Minutes, PowerPoint. The comments from Facebook were responded to during the public meeting, see Exhibit E. The Village of Ashville has a budget of over \$63,300 to maintain the park area, see Exhibit F – 2015 Appropriation Park Budget. If approved money will be set aside for the maintenance of the “Roundabout Trail”.

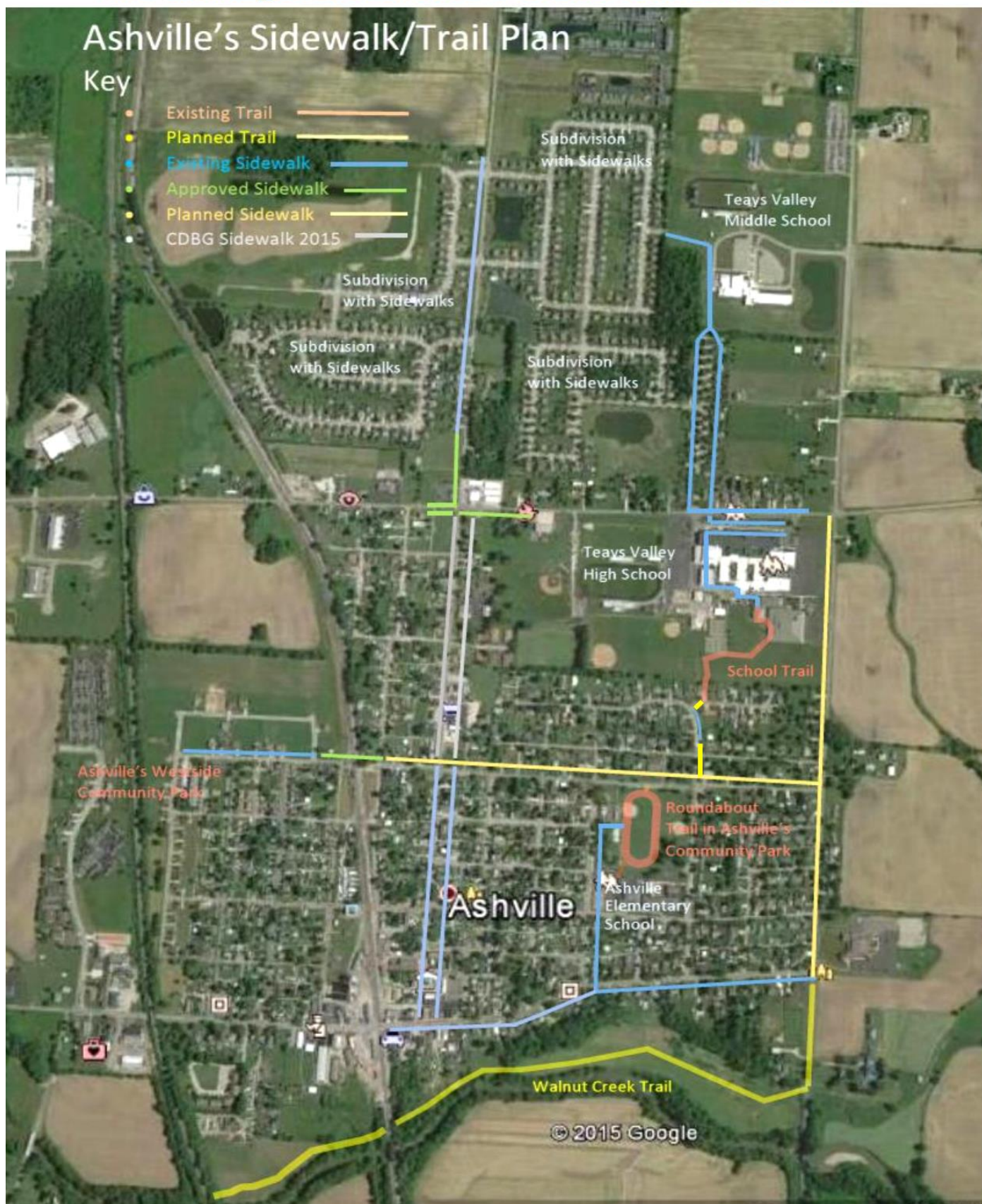

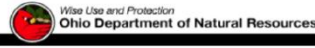
Ashville's Sidewalk/Trail Plan



ORDINANCE 2014-09 OF THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE



AN ORDINANCE TO MAKE TEMPORARY APPROPRIATIONS FOR THE NEXT YEAR'S EXPENSES AND OTHER EXPENDITURES OF THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, STATE OF OHIO, BASED UPON THE CERTIFICATE OF ESTIMATED RESOURCES ISSUED BY THE PICKAWAY COUNTY BUDGET COMMISSION FOR THE FISCAL YEAR BEGINNING JANUARY 1, 2015, AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.

Now, Therefore, be it Resolved by the Council of the Village of Ashville, State of Ohio the following:

Section One:

That the 2015 Appropriations Ordinance is hereby designed to reflect the Certificate of Estimated Resources. Such amendments amounts and spending targets are listed in Exhibit I, which shall become part of this ordinance.

Section Two:

That the "Non-binding Narrative for the 2015 Budget" remark is defined as an indication of management's intended allocation of amounts approved by Council and that it does not indicate the legal level of control established by Council."

Section Three:

That the Village Council hereby authorizes that funds may be expended for coffee, meals, refreshments and /or other amenities for municipal officers, employees or other persons with the approval of the Mayor or VA and certified by Fiscal Officer for payment.

Section Four:

The Village Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to make payments from any of the foregoing appropriations and to make supplemental appropriations between "Object" codes within the same "Fund" and "Program" area as provided by the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) with the exception of "Object" codes 590 and 690 from which only the Mayor and/or Village Administrator are authorized to approve expenditures or supplemental appropriations. That the Village Council hereby authorizes that the fiscal officer can expend funds for employees' salaries and benefits as reflected in the appropriation budget indicates in Exhibit I.

Section Five:

And the Village Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to draw warrants on the Village Treasury for payments from any of the foregoing appropriations upon receiving proper certificates and vouchers therefor, approved by the Council or officers authorized by law to approve the same, or an ordinance or resolution of Council to make the expenditure, provided that no warrants shall be drawn or paid for salaries or wages except to persons employed by authority of and in accordance with law or ordinance. Provided further that the appropriations for contingencies can only be expended upon vote of two-thirds of Council for items of expense constituting a legal obligation against the village, and for purposes other than those covered by other specific appropriations herein made.

Section Five:

That this ordinance is hereby declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the preservation of the public peace, health and safety of the Municipality and its inhabitants for the reason that there exists an imperative necessity for the earliest publication and distribution of current Replacement Pages to the officials and residents of the Municipality, so as to facilitate administration, daily operation and avoid practical and legal entanglements, and shall go into full force and effect immediately upon its passage by Council.
