

The roadway surface has significantly deteriorated. The elevation creates considerable water runoff issues. The curb has been buried by past pavement application. The sidewalk on the east side is no longer visible or useable. This is also the result of years of applying pavement but not milling enough. The detailed description will indicated how these problems will be corrected.

The project cost is \$705,938. Ashville is requesting \$35,000 of CDBG Funding. The Village of Ashville will pay the balance \$670,938 of 2011-620-590 & 690-0000 Street Funds, 2101-610-369-0000 Motor Vehicle Funds, 5101-533-590-0000 Water Other Capital Outlay Funds, and Stormwater 5704-800-590-0000 Other Capital Outlay . Fund. Resolution 02-2024 will provide legislative support for the submission, Exhibit Six. Exhibit Seven is the Fiscal Officer Certification of Funds and the 2024 Permanent Expense Appropriation Budget.
