ASHVILLE COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION

Held: AUGUST 17, 2020

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The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:32 PM to 7:30 PM in the Council Meeting Room at 200 East Station Street, Ashville, Ohio 43103. MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Roger Clark moved, seconded by David Rainey, to approve the minutes of the August 3, 2020 Regular Session as presented. All votes were yea.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR: The VA read his monthly report which included updates on the upcoming road paving project on SR 316.

POLICE DEPARTMENT: Chief George read his monthly report and introduced Ashville PD's newest officer, Adam Bour. Mayor Wise followed Bour's introduction by administering the Oath of Office. George then announced the retirement of auxiliary officers Michael Domineck and Richard Cutshall. Chief George and Mayor Wise thanked the retirees for their service to the village. Mayor Wise asked the chief if Covid-19 had impacted crime rates in the village. George replied that it's not too bad.

TAX DEPARTMENT: Nelson Embrey moved, seconded by Randy Loveless, to approve the Tax Administrator's report. All votes were yea.
