The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:37 PM to 6:58 PM in an online meeting provided by Microsoft Teams. Mayor Wise called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

**MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING:** Roger Clark moved, seconded by Randy Loveless, to approve the minutes of the January 25, 2021 Regular Session as presented. All votes were yea.

### DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

**VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR:** The VA reported that the monthly newsletter is ready and includes information about meter reading and operation, how leaks occur, and a description of what each fee on the water bill is for.

**STREET DEPARTMENT:** Mayor Wise reported that just over 90 tons of salt had been used during street salting so far this year.

### LEGISLATION

#### ORDINANCE(S) FOR FIRST READING

**02-2021 A RESOLUTION REPEALING RESOLUTION 13-2020 AND ADOPTING A STATEMENT OF SERVICES AND A STATEMENT REGARDING POSSIBLE INCOMPATIBLE LAND USES AND ZONING BUFFER FOR A PROPOSED ANNEXATION OF ±76.642 ACRES FROM HARRISON TOWNSHIP TO THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE AND DECLARING AN EMERGENCY.** Nelson Embrey moved, seconded by Roger Clark, to have the First Reading. All votes were yea. After the reading, Nelson Embrey moved, seconded by Roger Clark, to accept the First Reading, suspend the Rules of Council, waive the Second and Third Readings, and adopt as an emergency measure. All votes were yea.

### COMMITTEE REPORTS

**COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE:** Mayor Wise reported that Council reviewed and discussed the Ohio Plan's 2021 policy renewal proposal.

**UTILITIES COMMITTEE:** Roger Clark reported that the committee reviewed the usage for the property owners of 546 Winston Avenue who challenged a bill they received for 43,000 gallons of usage. Clark said that after discussion, the committee agreed to waive penalties associated with this usage and issue a credit for 6,000 gallons of usage for total credit of \$215.90. The property owner is responsible for the bill balance of \$990.23.

Nelson Embrey moved, seconded by David Rainey, to approve the Committee of the Whole and Utilities Committee Reports. All votes were yea.

**MAYOR'S REPORT:** Mayor Wise announced that, as long as the Covid case numbers continue to decline, he would like to start meeting in person in March. Wise reported that Dairy Diamond, owned by Stephanie Wharton, held a snowman picture contest over the weekend with the winner to receive a free pizza but ended up giving everyone who submitted a picture a free pizza. Wise and Council shared their appreciation for Wharton and her generosity.

### CLERK/FISCAL OFFICER'S REPORT:
