Mayor Wise called the meeting to order at 6:34 PM. Answering roll call were Roger Clark, Randy Loveless, Tracie Sorvillo and Nelson Embrey. Brad Lutz and David Rainey were excused. Also present were Police Chief Jeff George and Jamie Mills.

MINUTES: Randy Loveless moved, seconded by Nelson Embrey, to approve the December 9, 2019 minutes as presented. All votes were yea.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor Wise reported that the police department ordered a new police cruiser which will be delivered within the next couple of months. Wise also reported that he applied for a grant to get a speed tracking wagon for the village PD.


VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR'S REPORT: Franklin Christman read his written report which included updates on the WWTP pump issues. Nelson Embrey asked the VA if any of the problems were under warranty and the VA said some were and that he would provide a list of those items to Council. Embrey also asked the VA if he was able to confirm what the solicitor's rate has been and the VA said it is \$170 per hour.

COUNCIL COMMENTS:

- Roger Clark asked if the stop sign at Scioto and Main could be removed. Mayor Wise said the sign controls the flow of traffic. Wise said during certain times during the day or after school events let out, it can be difficult for residents to back out of their drive ways. Clark asked if removing the stop signs for a six-month period to see what, if any, feedback the village gets. Wise, Sorvillo and Embrey opposed the idea of removing the signs, even temporarily.

Nelson Embrey moved, seconded by Randy Loveless to adjourn. All votes were yea and the meeting adjourned at 7:08 PM.
