The Mayor's Court Mission Statement

The Village of Ashville Mayor's Court adjudicates cases arising out of alleged violations of local ordinances and certain State laws. The Court is headed by the Magistrate, Howard Mellon, assisted by the Clerk of Court, April Grube, Bailiff, Larry Rathburn, and other Court staff. It is the Court's mission to provide efficient, fair resolution of all matters coming before it, and to ensure that all Court users are afforded ready access to the Court.

Objective: Mayor's Court has undertaken to provide the highest quality service to the public and the Village of Ashville. Our staff is dedicated to providing an environment so as to instill confidence in, and respect for, the judicial system in general, and the Village of Ashville Mayor's Court. It is the mission of the Court to ensure that due process of law and fundamental fairness are afforded to all who appear before the Court, and that customer service by the court staff is given the highest priority.

The Court will emphasize public awareness and education, through development of a more detailed website and informational brochures for users.

The Court will continue to examine, refine, and further develop, as appropriate, its procedures, so that the Court may be administered in the most efficient and businesslike manner.

Magistrate, Howard Mellon...Magistrate Mellon is a native of New York City but has been a central Ohio resident for over 35 years. He graduated from The Ohio State University College of Law in 1977 and has operated his law practice in Columbus since 1982.

Howard has served as Magistrate in Ashville since 2000 and also serves as Magistrate in several other communities in central Ohio. He has an extensive background in criminal justice and law enforcement matters and has also served as a Police Academy Instructor in Ohio.

As Village Magistrate, Howard is entitled to hear and determine prosecutions and criminal causes that are within the jurisdiction of the mayor's court. The Village Magistrate is appointed by the Mayor.

Tickets and Fines

If you receive a traffic citation from the Village of Ashville Police Department, you must take action to resolve the matter. Failure to take any action in regards to a citation could result in the suspension of your driver's license and a warrant being issued for your arrest.

If you are not required to appear in Mayor's Court, you may:

- Pay the citation in person prior to the court date during normal business hours at:
Village of Ashville Administrative Office Building, 200 Station Street East, Ashville, Ohio 43103
- Pay the citation via U.S. Mail by signing the "Guilty Plea" on the back of the blue copy of the citation and sending it along with a check, money order or cashier's check for the amount of the fine.

Appear at Mayor's Court on the time and date listed on the citation supplement. Mayor's Court is held at:

If you are ordered into Mayor's Court, you must appear on the date and time listed on the citation supplement. Failure to appear may result in a warrant for your arrest and suspension of your driver's license.

If you did not show current proof of Financial Responsibility (vehicle insurance) and it is marked on the citation as not showing proof of insurance, you must bring in proof to cover the date and time of the citation or your license is subject to suspension by the Ohio Bureau of Motor Vehicles.

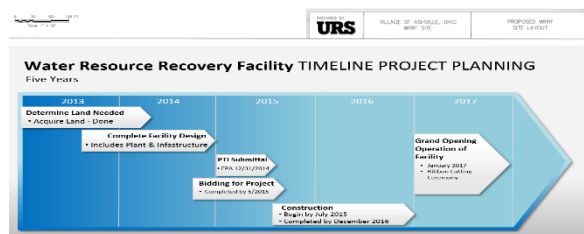
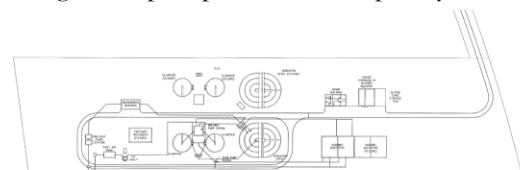
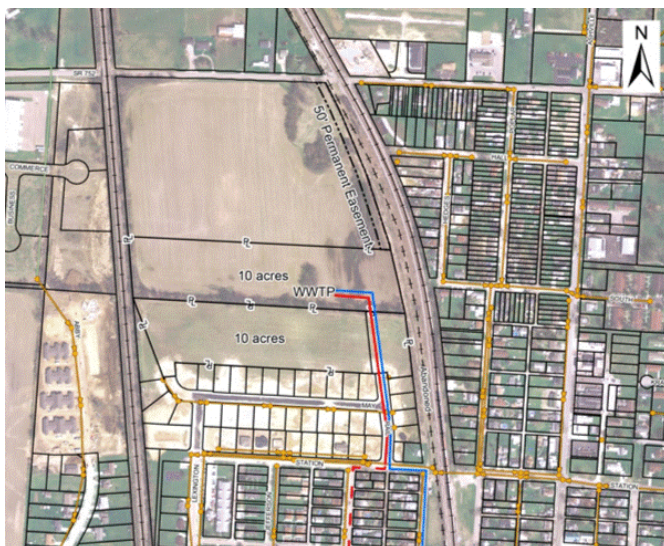

Water Resource Recovery Facility

The staff, council, and mayor have been working with URS to first evaluate our wastewater operations and facility. URS is an engineering firm hired to evaluate and make wastewater recommendations. Their evaluation and recommendation resulted in the village acquiring land for the creation of a Water Resource Recovery Facility. The location is shown below and the timeline is to the right. Design plans are being completed. This will be submitted to the OhioEPA for approval. To follow this project go to www.ashvilleohio.gov and click on the project logo.  For purposes of transparency we are making that report public and completely accessible.



10 Year Project
The first step for this project occurred in 2009. Council, Mayor, and Staff have discussed expansion of the facility several years before that date. Now that discussion is moving forward because of the need and because of the demand (findings & Orders) by the OhioEPA.

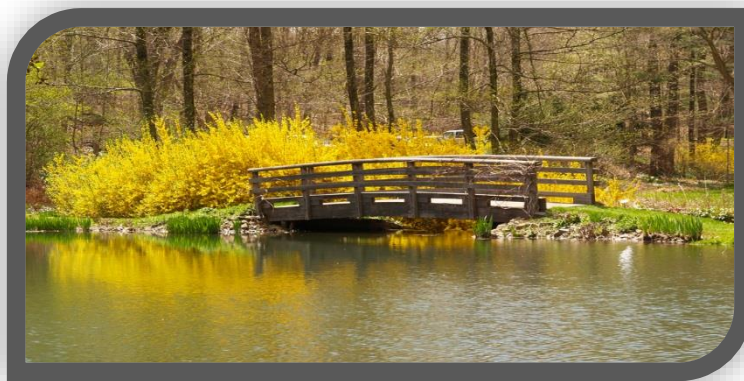

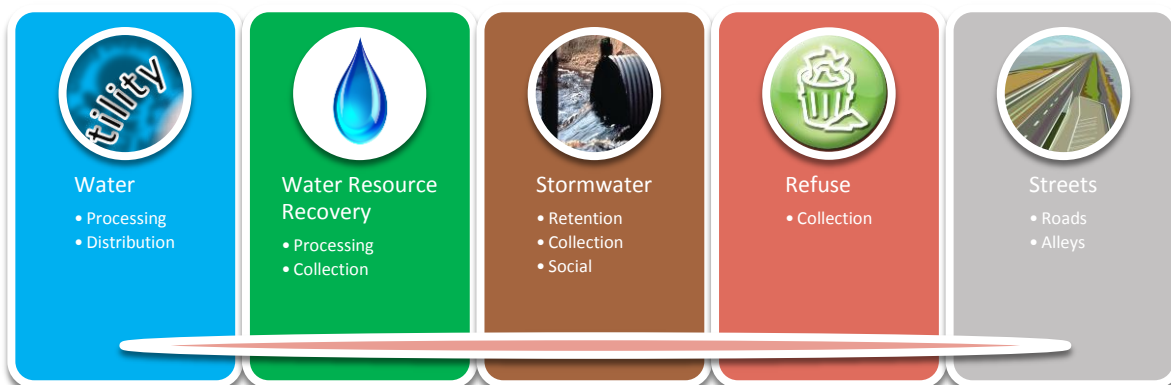
