

## Police Beat 07-2014

The law indicates that no person shall open the door of a vehicle on the side available to moving traffic unless, and until it is reasonably safe to do so, and can be done without interfering with the movement of other traffic. Nor shall any person leave a door open on the side of a vehicle available to moving traffic for a period of time longer than necessary to load or unload passengers. Therefore it is wise to use caution when parked on the street and opening your driver's side car doors to avoid accidents resulting in property damage or personal injury. Section 4511.70 of the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) <http://codes.ohio.gov/orc/4511.70> and section 351.08 of the Ashville Codified Ordinance.

No minor under the age of eighteen years shall be outside their residence and/or property between the hours of 12:00 a.m. and 5:00 a.m. the following day unless accompanied by their parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor, or when the minor is on an emergency errand or legitimate business directed by his parent, guardian or other adult person having the care and custody of the minor. (Codified Village Ordinance Number 537.19)

April showers bring May flowers, but they also bring decreased visibility and hazardous road conditions. Headlights on motor vehicles are required anytime there is insufficient light or unfavorable atmospheric conditions that would render other vehicles, pedestrians, or substantial objects in the roadway undiscernible at a distance of 1000 feet. Headlights are also required anytime windshield wipers are needed due precipitation on the windshield. Don't assume other drivers can see you just because you can see them, and turn your headlights on in the rain or other unfavorable weather, even during daytime hours. Drive safe. (ORC 4513.03A2-3)

### Fishing in Retention Ponds

There are several retention ponds in the northern part of the village that attract people who like to fish. Please pay close attention to the warnings posted at these ponds. The ponds at Ashton Village Phase II (north of Monroe Dr.) are posted No Fishing, No Swimming, and No Boating. This includes both residents and non-residents of that subdivision. The pond in Ashton Woods (along Morrison Dr.) is posted No Trespassing, and that fishing is for residents of the Ashton Woods subdivision and their guests only. Fishing in the Ashton Woods pond is catch and release only, and residents should obtain written permission from the home owners association prior to fishing there. These regulations exist in order to prevent unwanted foot traffic in the yards of nearby homes, and to prevent litter and damage to the ponds themselves.
