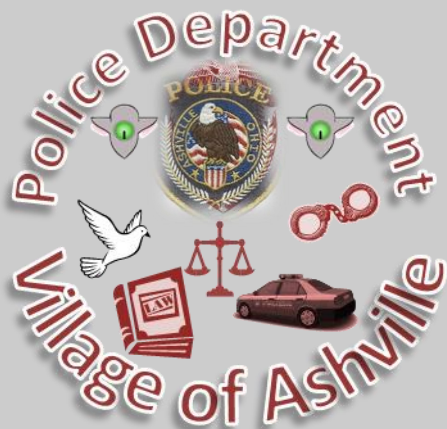

Loyalty

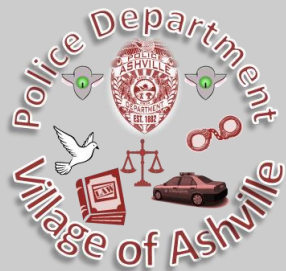
Our officers are not only loyal to the administration and the officers appointed over them, but also to their fellow officers and the citizens they serve.
