Leaf Pick-up Ashville's Service Department



The Village's Leaf pick-up service begins the first week of November. It is scheduled to continue through Monday, December 7th. The exact date is driven in large part by weather and the leaves on the ground. The next newsletter issue will talk about the village's work for snow and ice removal. This usually follows leaf pick-up but they may overlap.

In the past the Service Department had a specific street schedule Monday through Friday. With the equipment we now have the entire village is checked each day.

NOTE: To be removed leaves must be taken to the street. The day to day pick-up may be

changed due to inclement weather or reasons beyond our control.

WHAT TO AVOID>>>>>>

Leaves piled in front or back of vehicles will not be picked-up; we use the ten (10) "foot rule" to prevent damage. It is also helpful not to place leaves under low hanging tree limbs because of the height of our equipment. **No brush or flowers will be picked up. Local Waste Services on Monday's Collection Day will take limbs that are bundled or weeds (flowers) that are bagged. They will also take bagged leaves.**

The size of our equipment prevents us from traveling in alleys.

Village of Ashville Income Tax Changes

The tax rate for the Village of Ashville local tax (commonly called the RITA tax) is still 1%; however, due to the enactment of House Bill 5 by the Ohio General Assembly, please note the following changes to the tax rules and regulations.

1. The **interest rate** assessed against any unpaid income tax and unpaid estimated income tax on individual returns will be **5%** for returns filed for the tax year 2016.
2. The **penalty rate** assessed against any unpaid income tax and unpaid estimated income tax on individual returns will be **15%** for returns filed for the tax year 2016.
3. The **late filing fee** will be **\$25.00 for each month or any fraction thereof, up to \$150.00** for **each** failure to timely file each return, regardless of the liability shown thereon.
4. **Estimated payments** for your 2016 taxes will be due:
April 15, 2016, June 15, 2016, September 15, 2016, and December 15, 2016.
5. **An annual return** shall be completed and filed by **every individual taxpayer eighteen (18) years of age or older.** (The college student exemption has been removed; all students 18 years of age or older must file and will be liable for any taxes due.)

Ordinance 2015-10 has the text of Chapter 192 the governing tax law after 2015. It can be found on our website: www.ashvilleohio.gov.
