Pay Online

Pay your utility bill

The web-portal for paying bills should be operational by January 5, 2016. You can access it by going to www.ashvilleohio.gov and clicking on the "Utility Online" symbol above. It will take you to the webpage, Figure One. After registering you will to "Sign-in" with your "User Name" and "Password". User name confirmation will be sent by email.

The first time you try to access you will need to register, (see "Register Now": Figure One.) When you register use the exact numbers on your "Account No. and your name exactly as it appears on your bill.

Electronic Checks are now being processed by the Village of Ashville through CUSTI and VANCO. (Information about VANCO can be found at www.vancopayments.com and about CUSTI at www.cusi.com.)

The Utility Billing Department is to enable the Web Portal function that allows customers to access their account information online. We hope you will find the features of this site convenient. Winter is here and the ponds are freezing over. Or are they? While we have not been able to locate statistics on how many people fall through the ice each year, we have learned that approximately 235 people are killed each year as a result of falling through ice. The ponds in our village have aeration devices that prevent ice from forming in the middle. While the ice on the edges of the ponds may seem thick enough to handle the weight of a person, the ice does get thinner the farther out one goes. The police department has already asked children to stay off of the ice on ponds in the village. Please help us to insure a safe winter and make sure our children stay off the ice.
