This will allow our customers to manage their account. The Cusi Customer Web Portal is a real-time, 2010 Share-Point web based application that presents data directly from the utility billing software database.

There is a fee for this service. The Village of Ashville does not get any part of that fee, it is paid to the software company. The fee is the greater of \$2.95 or 3%

of the amount due. For example, on a \$100 payment, the fee will be \$3.00.

The Customer Web Portal is a secure system since the portal is hosted on a Rackspace server outside of Ashville's office.

Users will need to register a user name and password using their account number and name on the account. Visa, MasterCard, Discover, and electronic checks are accepted.
