With the new year comes changes in the Village of Ashville offices. I will start with introducing myself. My name is Andi Dawson and I am the new Communication Specialist for the village. My goal is to make communication between the village and residents easier and create more efficient ways to meet the needs of the residents. I will be managing all of the social media pages, website editing and newsletter as well as coordinating the use of park facilities. You can reach me through our Ashville Facebook page, Twitter or at the office by calling 740-983-7171 or adawson@ashvilleohio.gov. Some of the other positions you will be familiar with, but this is a good time to re-emphasize that information.

The village will be making a change when you call the office during working hours. Instead of being answered directly you will

reach an auto attendant. The purpose is to direct you more quickly and accurately to the information you are calling to obtain.

For example, when you call 740-983-6367 and dial 1 you will be able to reach Patricia Cavinee. She is the Tax Administrator and also will be the person you go for the Planning & Zoning and Building Department. Therefore, permits for both Planning & Zoning/Building Department will be submitted to her. Her direct line is 983-7172.

When you call 740-983-6367 and dial 2 you will reach April Grube. She is the clerk-Fiscal Officer and will continue the function of Mayor's Court Clerk.

The auto attendant will direct you to Utility Clerk Lindsay Mayse if you dial 0. She will be able to address utility department questions and direct all other calls to the area it needs to go.

By making these communication changes our goal is for our office staff to provide residents with better customer service. With an automated phone system it will be easier to reach the person who can best assist you without having to be placed on hold. You may under this process get a voice mail since the person you are calling may be talking to another customer.

Our staff is being directed to check voice mail messages as they come in, specifically every

When you see the above image it will inform you that the article you are reading concerns refuse in the Village of Ashville which now includes recycling. The residential rate is now \$14.55. Green recycle bins have been distributed and if you were missed or need a second bin they are available at the administrative office. You can also get a larger container, a red 65

6.8 Senior Citizen Discount. The Contractor shall provide Residents who are sixty-two (62) years of age or older and the head of household a discount of ten percent (10%) or one dollar and fifty cents (\$1.50), whichever is greater, off the per Residential Unit charge contained in attached Exhibit A. By agreement, either the City/Township/Village or the

Contractor will maintain a list of Residents entitled to this discount, which list shall be provided upon request to the other party.

To obtain this Senior Citizen Discount visit the administrative offices at 200 Station Street East during regular business hours to sign-up for the 10% Senior Citizen Discount. For validation purposes bring a Driver's Licenses or State of Ohio ID.
