



Ashville's 2015 Utility Report Consumer Confidence Report (CCR)

This is a Special Edition of the Ashville Newsletter. Annually we report on the quality of water provided to our residents. The Ohio Environmental Protection Agency (Ohio-EPA) calls this the CCR or Consumer Confidence Report. All community public water systems are required to prepare a CCR annually and make the report available to their customers. The report contains information on the community's drinking water including the source of the water, contaminants detected, the likely sources of detected contaminants, health effects of the contaminants when violations occur, and availability of source water assessments.

CCR's are required by the 1996 amendments to the Safe Drinking Water Act. The Federal Rule (40 CFR 141.151-155) was finalized August 19, 1998. We hope this information will provide you comfort and security. We recognize that water quality is a very important area of operation.
