
NEW BUSINESS:

NEW BUSINESS:


1. PERSONNEL – Dave Cummins requested to be placed on the next Safety Committee meeting so that he could attend the Harrison Trustee meeting.

OLD BUSINESS:




NEW BUSINESS:

OLD BUSINESS:


