2.1 PROJECT NAME: Ashville Intersection Improvements for SR 752 at Long St.

2.2 BRIEF PROJECT DESCRIPTION - (Sections A through C):

A: SPECIFIC LOCATION:

The Intersection of SR 752 and Long Street within the Village of Ashville, OH.

PROJECT ZIP CODE: 43103

B: PROJECT COMPONENTS:

This project will significantly improve vehicular and pedestrian safety by replacing the existing signal, adding left turn lanes in all four directions, adding key sidewalk segments and ADA ramps at each radius return, and improving drainage with new storm sewers.

C: PHYSICAL DIMENSIONS:

This project will provide new pavement sections approximately 350 feet north and south of SR 752 on Long St., and 425 feet east and west of Long Street on SR 752 for a total project length of 1550 feet. Lane widths of 11' with 2' shoulders are provided at all uncurbed sections, and intersection radii are 35'. More than 900' of sidewalk extensions are provided along the north and east legs of the project to enhance school connectivity.

D: DESIGN SERVICE CAPACITY:

Detail current service capacity versus proposed service level.

The intersection currently operates at at LOS "D" and vehicle backups exceeding 20 units have been observed during peak conditions. The proposed improvements are anticipated to improve the LOS to "B" and significantly reduce traffic crash occurrences.
