Enclosed is the District 17 Round 30 Application and supporting material for the Village of Ashville.

In 2007, the Village of Ashville had Pomeroy and Associates provide a cost estimate to bring a sewer connector line called "Mud Run Sanitary Sewer". That cost ranged from 8.69 million to 3.18 million dollars. The location of the new plant will greatly reduce the cost to connect to the primary economic development area to the west of the Village.
