

The Mayor's Column



2011 Project Update

Many projects are on our list for 2011 and I thought it would be a good idea to review with you what they are and their status:

- ◆ **2011 Paving Project** (\$170,000) - Gary, Jefferson, Park, Rich, and Wright Street, as this goes to press, Jefferson Park and Rich have been milled. Columbia Gas is upgrading gas laterals and a gas main on Jefferson starting July 25th. After gas lines are repaired paving and curb replacement can move ahead, approximately August 1st. This project has a webpage that is updated daily and weekly, www.ashvilleohio.gov.
- ◆ **Water Tank Renovation Project** (\$62,000/yr)- The tower at the water plant is 99% complete with some painting it will be done. The interior of the 752 tower has been completed and the final painting is occurring as this goes to press. We have placed the photos of the stages of renovation on our webpage.
- ◆ **CDBG Miller Avenue Lighting Project** (\$18,000) - Lights are installed and may be lit by the time you read this article. There was a gap of street lighting between the Senior Apartments lights to the south. That was corrected by this project. We are looking at other area needing lit. Please let us know if you think that would be good in your location, mayorwise@ashvilleohio.gov.
- ◆ **Emergency Power Project** (\$25,000) - Gas Generators are being installed at the Police Station and Administrative Office Building. Generators here and 50% of installation has been completed. The project should be completed by the end of August.
- ◆ **St.Rt 752 & Long Street Project** (\$900,000) - Most of the construction will be done in 2012. The final design will be completed this year with some infrastructure replacement for the project, i.e. storm, water, & electric.
