2011 Annual Report

I want to start out the report about 2011 by saying it has been an honor to serve as Mayor and to be granted the opportunity to serve again after the fall election. It has also been a pleasure to work with a council which is able to work independently and to challenge each other. It was also a time of mix emotions, after attending Chester Gloyd's funeral a short time after congratulating him on his election to Village Council.

In general these are the highlights for 2011:

Financially we put together the budget for 2011. We did it in a manner to anticipate future needs and possible reductions in revenue. A 2011 Strategic Plan was developed. One of the initiatives of that plan is to enhance the working relationships with businesses. You can see that in previous Mayor's Columns.

As with the CEDA we are striving to find partners for collabora-

tion. We want the North Gate Alliance to be a source of Economic Development. It has been through a revenue stream from the Harrison Township JEDD. More economic development is likely with the East/West Connector.

We anticipate the St. Rte.752 & 316 intersection improvement later this year. Part of that was just completed with the Center Alley Storm Sewer Project. A possible drainage of Ashton Wood Pond may be a secondary benefit.

Paving and repaving costs have skyrocketed. The village is committed to make our streets as safe as possible but this is an increasing challenge for all municipalities.

In the utility area we have not only made our towers look new from the exterior but there interior has been completely refurbished. That will help us improve the quality of the water. Some

reorganization has occurred in utility operations.

For wastewater we are looking at improving or moving the facility. This is based upon recommendation of the EPA and URS, a consultant hired last year. I and I work is also occurring.

In the Police Department we are working on continued drug and traffic enforcement. We are working on holding down the cost.

Planning and Zoning work includes signage and uniform enforcement of codes with the Police Department.

Grant money will be used for tearing down of abandoned houses. Currently we have identified four locations.
