The Mayor's Column - Election Day



March 6th is election day for Ohio. While it is listed as a Primary Election, there are two general election issues that can be voted on as a party member or as a nonpartisan. You can on election day request one of the following ballots:

- ◆ Democratic Primary Ballot
- ◆ Green Party Ballot
- ◆ Libertarian Party Ballot
- ◆ Nonpartisan Ballot
- ◆ Republican Primary Ballot

The village is not taking a position on these issues or those running for office. We wish to provide you the information so that you can evaluate them for yourself and make an informed choice.

If you go on the internet you can find information. We encourage you to research and validate what is published.

You will also find information about the two local issues on

page three of our October 28, 2011 Newsletter. This newsletter can be found on our website: www.ashvilleohio.gov. Look under "Community & Links" and click the link labeled "Newsletter".

One issue involves Paint Valley Alcohol Drug Addiction and Mental Health Services. The second issue involves Teays Valley. The first issue has information at their website: <http://www.pvadamh.org>. There is a website supporting the Teays Valley Issue <http://www.wix.com/teaysvalley/levy>. The other opposite opinion for these issues can be read in the comments sections of web based newspapers like the Circleville Herald.

Remember the order of the candidates will vary depending on the precinct you are registered. Also, the Green and Libertarian Ballot is

different from the nonpartisan by having a "Write-in" area for U.S. Senator.

Consumer Price Index (CPI) Results in 3.0% Utility Increase

In 2009, Village Council passed an Ordinance that would allow for a method to keep the cost of operating utilities in line with the fees associated with that utility. Ordinance 2009-03 indicates that after December, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) is used to determine what is needed to maintain a rate schedule consistent with costs, that adjustment is based upon a December to December average. For 2009 the

adjustment was 2.7% and for 2010 the adjustment was 1.5%. The 2011 average CPI was 3.0% and that will be reflected in the next billing cycle. The impact of the rate change can be seen on the table to the right based upon a per 1000 gallons of usage. The Water Tower fee is not impacted by the CPI. Therefore, no adjustment is needed. PROPOSED REPLACEMENT OF INCOME TAX TEAYS VALLEY LOCAL SCHOOL DISTRICT PICKAWAY, FAIRFIELD AND FRANKLIN COUNTIES

A majority affirmative vote is necessary for passage

Shall the existing tax of three-quarters of one percent (0.75%) on the school district income of individuals and estates imposed by the Teays Valley Local School District, Pickaway, Fairfield and Franklin Counties, Ohio, be replaced by a tax of one and one-half percent (1.5%) on the earned income of individuals residing in the school district for a continuing period of time, beginning January 1, 2013, for the purpose of providing for current expenses of the School District? If the new tax is not approved, the existing tax will remain in effect under its original authority, for the remainder of its previously approved term.
