The Mayor's Column - Infiltration & Inflow (I & I)

What is I & I?

I & I is storm and/or groundwater that enters the sewer system through cracked pipes, leaky manholes, or improperly connected storm drains, down spouts and sump pumps. Most inflow comes from storm water (rain) and most infiltration comes from groundwater. I & I affects the size of Ashville's delivery and treatment systems and, ultimately, the rate businesses and residents pay to operate and maintain them.

Infiltration

The first I, Infiltration, is groundwater, or groundwater that is influenced by surface water that enters sewer pipes (interceptors, collectors, man-

holes(MH), or sidesewers) through holes, breaks, joint failures, connection failures and other openings. Infiltration quantities often exhibit seasonal variation in response to groundwater levels. Storm events can trigger a rise in groundwater levels and increase infiltration flows.

Inflow

The second I, Inflow is surface water that enters the wastewater system from yard, roof and footing drains, from cross-connections with storm drains, downspouts, and through holes in manhole covers. Inflow occurs as a result of storm events such as rainfall, snowfall, springs or snow melt that contribute to excessive sewer flows. Inflow can

also occur in sewer pipes or facilities that are subject to excessive sewage flows due to direct or indirect connections to a water body or operational inflows such as water system connections for sewer cleaning. Peak inflow can occur during heavy storm events when storm sewer systems are surcharged, resulting in hydraulic backups and local ponding.

I & I is an issue receiving increased scrutiny from the Ohio EPA. This concern and working to reduce I & I has resulted in a decision to delineate a portion of the existing sewer fee to I&I, see below:

Consumer Price Index (CPI) Results in 1.7% Utility Increase

In 2009, Village Council passed an Ordinance that would allow for a method to keep the cost of operating utilities in line with the fees associated with that utility. Ordinance 2009-03 indicates that after December, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) is used to determine what is needed to maintain a rate schedule consistent with costs, that adjustment is based upon a December to December average. For 2009 the

adjustment was 2.7%, for 2010 that was 1.5%, and for 2011 that was 3.0%. The CPI for 2012 is a 1.7% average. That percentage will be reflected in the next billing cycle. The impact of the rate change can be seen on the table to the right based upon a per 1000 gallons of usage. The Water Tower fee is not impacted by the CPI. Therefore, there is no adjustment. Infiltration & Inflow (I & I)

A portion of the new total sewer fee will be set aside for I & I. That set aside amount will be 34¢ of the/thousand gallon wastewater fee. The result of that can be seen in the table to the right.
