
The picture to the right was taken during street painting before school begins, a demonstration of multiple department cooperation.

## Do You Know What to Do With Tree Limbs ?

In driving around the village it has been observed that tree limbs have been placed on the curb and have not been removed. You may be expecting Local Waste Services (LWS) to remove them. Our contracted refuse hauler LWS will remove these limbs if you do one of two things. You can place the limbs in a refuse container or bundle the limbs into lengths that do not exceed five (5) feet.

The Village of Ashville has several active street projects. We have two (2) on going projects. The first icon below is being used for the Ohio Public Works Commission (OPWC) Long Street and State Route 752 Intersection Project. As soon as the utilities have been buried Decker Construction will complete the roadway. The second icon is for the OPWC Griggs Railroad Crossing Relocation Project. Paving will shortly be occurring. The last two (2) icons involve new projects. We have a CDBG West Station Street Resurfacing Project between Scioto Street and Lexington Avenue. The last icon is for a joint project with the Pickaway County Engineering Office for the resurfacing of Ashville Pike and Long Street. This joint venture will allow multiple jurisdictions to have a seamless project. KMC will be doing some surface repairs projected to begin August 3<sup>rd</sup>. Kokosing Construction was awarded the county contract for the resurfacing. It is projected to begin the week of August 17<sup>th</sup>.
