The Legislative Corner

This is a new article for the newsletter. It will provide the title to Ordinances and Resolutions being considered by Village Council. To read the entire text you will need to go to our website. Enacted legislation will be found under "Village Government: and Legislation that is being consider can be found under "Village Council—Agenda".

- ◇ 2016-04 An Ordinance to amend Ordinance 929.02 (96-13, 2006-06, 2009-03, 2010-07) to alter the charge for water services in the Village of Ashville. This amended Ordinance will not conflict with the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) limitations and declaring an emergency.
- ◇ 2016-05 An Ordinance to make Permanent Appropriations for the current year's expenses and other expenditures of the Village of Ashville, State of Ohio, based upon the Amended Certificate of Resources issued by the Pickaway County Budget Commission for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2016, and declaring an emergency.
- ◇ 05-2016 A Resolution adopting a plan under the Ohio Public Employees Deferred Compensation Program administered by the Ohio Public Employees Deferred Compensation Board for participation by "Eligible Employees" of the Village of Ashville.
- ◇ 04-2016 A Resolution authorizing the Mayor or Village Administrator to execute an Assignment Agreement with South Central Power Company for the purpose of furthering the Ashville Intersection Improvements – State Route 752 and Long Street Project (CT72N & CT73N).
