**Ashville Viking Festival 13th ANNUAL FESTIVAL**

In Ashville the Viking Festival will be the place to be on April 30<sup>th</sup> and May 1<sup>st</sup>. It starts at 10 AM and the admission price is a canned food donation.

The festival is a celebration of Scandinavian and World History. Over 100 Viking and other re-enactors from all over the country will be in attendance.

The Festival is focused on the history and lifestyle of the Vikings. The primary time being depicted will be 10<sup>th</sup> century Vikings. For educational purposes, other time periods will be represented.

The Viking re-enactors will be joined by Ancient Romans, 10<sup>th</sup> Century Irish, and 15<sup>th</sup> Century German Landsknechts.

Jousting from Combatant's Keep will be jousting twice a day. You can meet the horses and jousters. See the picture below.

**The Legislative Corner**

This is a new article for the newsletter. It will provide the title to Ordinances and Resolutions being considered by Village Council. To read the entire text you will need to go to our website. Enacted legislation will be found under "Village Government: and Legislation that is being consider can be found under "Village Council—Agenda".

- ◇ 2016-04 An Ordinance to amend Ordinance 929.02 (96-13, 2006-06, 2009-03, 2010-07) to alter the charge for water services in the Village of Ashville. This amended Ordinance will not conflict with the Ohio Revised Code (ORC) limitations and declaring an emergency.
- ◇ 2016-05 An Ordinance to make Permanent Appropriations for the current year's expenses and other expenditures of the Village of Ashville, State of Ohio, based upon the Amended Certificate of Resources issued by the Pickaway County Budget Commission for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2016, and declaring an emergency.
- ◇ 2016-06 An Ordinance to amend Section 2 and Section 3 OF Ordinance 2013-05 to allow employees who have reached the maximum pay rate in their position to be eligible to receive the 2016 cluster adjustment of 1.5% and 1.5% rate increase on the anniversary of their date of hire as a full-time employee of the Village of Ashville.
- ◇ 05-2016 A Resolution adopting a plan under the Ohio Public Employees Deferred Compensation Program administered by the Ohio Public Employees Deferred Compensation Board for participation by "Eligible Employees" of the Village of Ashville.


