The Festival is focused on the history and lifestyle of the Vikings. The primary time being depicted will be 10th century Vikings. For educational purposes, other time periods will be represented.



The Viking re-enactors will be joined by Ancient Romans, 10th Century Irish, and 15th Century German Landsknechts.

Consumer Price Index (CPI) and the Village of Ashville Utility Rate


In 2009, Village Council passed an Ordinance that would allow for a method to keep the cost of operating utilities in line with the fees associated with that utility. Ordinance 2009-03 indicates that after December, the Consumer Price Index (CPI) will be used to determine what is needed to maintain a rate schedule consistent with costs. The historic percentages are indicated to the right.

The current percentage is 2.1% and will be reflected in the next billing cycle. The impact of the rate change can be seen on the table to the right based upon a per 1000 gallons of usage. The Water Tower fee is not

impacted by the CPI. A description of the CPI and more information can be found at www.ashvilleohio.gov
