The Mayor's Column—Rickenbacker Activity

Since 2016, Ashville has been on two committees that are working on developing a strategic plan for the Rickenbacker area. One committee coordinated by the Columbus Regional Airport Authority (CRAA) is focused directly on the Rickenbacker International Airport, Intermodal and Logistic Park. The other committee coordinated by the Mid-Ohio Regional Planning Commission (MORPC) is focused on the area just outside of Rickenbacker. Both plans should be finalized in June or July of 2018.

It seems like a good time to provide you some information about these committees. Ashville is a member of the North Gate Alliance Joint Economic Development District (JEDD). As a stakeholder in this area economic benefit to this area provides revenue to Ashville through their employee JEDD income tax. Rickenbacker International Airport (RIA) is a joint use former military airbase and is one of the world's only cargo dedicated airports. The CRAA objective is to outline a long range strategic direction to be a global logistics leader. The first chart on page two show

you why the location is such an advantage. Rickenbacker is one day away from a large population. The second chart indicates the historic growth through 2017. The last chart clearly reveals why planning is vital with projected growth through 2036.

MORPC's objective is to complete a Rickenbacker Area Comprehensive Study. The result will be a strategy for assisting Central Ohio stakeholders to position and develop the Rickenbacker area as a successful international logistics hub. Both processes engage the community and partner organizations to ensure it reflects the thinking of local and national experts and the Region. This study will look at transportation, housing, utilities (water, wastewater, energy, & broadband), and economics.

The goal of this plan is to provide options for future airport development that address cur-

rent and future demand, identify the role of the airport in the local, regional and national aviation system, and provide potential utilization or re-use options for existing infrastructure and airport facilities.

This effort is being funded with a grant from the Federal Aviation Administration (FAA). The plans are expected to be completed in 2018. To find out information about the CRAA study go to the following:


ASHVILLE VISION STATEMENT

Pothole Reporting



International Cargo Growth




Chart 2 Wide body freighter arrivals from international points of origin

Air Cargo Forecast


