ASHVILLE COUNCIL REGULAR SESSION

Held: MARCH 4, 2019

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The Council of Ashville convened in Regular Session from 6:33 PM to 7:20 PM in the Council Meeting Room at 200 East Station Street, Ashville, Ohio 43103. Mayor Wise called the meeting to order with the Pledge of Allegiance and a moment of silence.

MINUTES OF PREVIOUS MEETING: Brad Lutz moved, seconded by Randy Loveless, to approve the February 25, 2019 minutes as presented. All votes were yea.

COMMITTEE OF THE WHOLE: Mayor Wise reviewed the February 11, 2018 Committee of the Whole meeting.

PRESENTATION:

1. Trevor Somogyi of PAAC (Pickaway Addiction Action Coalition) discussed the current opioid epidemic and what role they are taking in preventing addiction and helping with recovery. Somogyi stated that the coalition works to establish family support groups, enhance access to services for incarcerated individuals, and improve community awareness and engagement.

MAYOR'S REPORT: Mayor Wise reported that he had received complaints that residents are leaving their trash cans out too long after the trash has been picked up. Wise reminded residents that trash cans are required to be removed from the curbside no later than 6:00 p.m. following trash collection. The mayor also noted that efforts are being made to make the village's website ADA compliant.

DEPARTMENTAL REPORTS

VILLAGE ADMINISTRATOR: The VA reported that an application had been sent to OPWC for grant funding for resurfacing State Route 316 and a grant had been approved for new picnic tables and benches in the open shelter house and playground area.

05-2019 A RESOLUTION OF THE VILLAGE OF ASHVILLE, PICKAWAY COUNTY, SUPPORTING HOUSE BILL 62 STATE TRANSPORTATION BUDGET TO IMPOSE AN ADDITIONAL 18¢ PER GALLON ON GASOLINE. THE GASOLINE TAX WILL PROVIDE FUNDING OF INFRASTRUCTURE OF THE STATE.
